- 2) 9:10 AM DISCUSS UPDATING PATROL RIFLES FOR CCSO
- a) Kidd indicated that numerous firearms that have been forfeited and have been housed in the evidence room at the Sheriff's office for as long as 25 years have been consigned to Red's Trading Post in Twin Falls for the amount of \$20,100. The combination of the sale of those firearms and trading in older mismatched firearms in need of updating for new rifles, they will end up with no costs to the taxpayers. Current ammunition would be compatible with the new guns. McMurray suggested declaring those rifles as surplus based on the fact that they are used and exchange them to updated weapons and procuring the appropriate documentation for that.

- 3) 9:16 AM BUDGET/MANPOWER DISCUSSION BY CCSO
- a) Sheriff Kidd indicated that his office was short on manpower with the residence program outside of the City of Burley limits. He has a deputy in the Jackson area and would like to appoint him as a Jackson resident deputy. To do that he would need to hire another deputy to fill his position. Kidd desired the Board's approval if it can be done within the parameters of the budget to replace the City Division deputy who then would become a resident deputy in the Jackson area. Concern was expressed that we had lost financial ground with City of Burley, subsidizing their service for this past year. Kidd said the City of Burley is presently conducting discussion and they are aware of that. The Board desired to begin negotiations with the City of Burley and set a date of expectation for completing that agreement for the new budget year. Commissioner Kunau said it might help if we were to fill expectations for areas outside the city limits of Burley. Christensen inquired about services in the City of Burley buffer area. Kidd said that the concentrated areas

and dense population areas require the most work. Kidd felt he could make it work if he shuffled manpower and funds. Kunau said the perception is that the County has given manpower to the City of Burley and Kidd said the City of Burley had no issues with City Division officers responding where there are needs. Crane responded for Kidd to see what he can put together.

- a) Assessor Davis inquired of the Bedke property tax situation from last week. Bedke doesn't necessarily want a refund, just wants to be credited. Crane asked that the Board be kept informed. The Assessor's Office took the homeowner's exemption inadvertently off the wrong person and Mr. Bedke should not have had the homeowner's exemption excluded.

10) 9:45 AM DEPARTMENT HEAD MEETING

a) DENNIS CRANE – BOARD CHAIRMAN

- i) Crane discussed with the department heads the Declo community meeting from the previous week. Meeting during the daytime and getting adequate information out about the meeting may have accounted for the lack of attendance.
- ii) The Board and elected officials will meet in Oakley for a community meeting at 7:00 p.m. Wednesday, May 8, 2012, and it is anticipated that the meeting will be an hour and a half long. That meeting will be at the Oakley Fire Station which has a classroom that can seat 100 people.
- iii) Crane also invited those who wanted to attend the Arbor Day activity to plant trees on the south side of the courthouse.

b) RANDY KIDD – SHERIFF

- i) New law enforcement vehicles will be arriving soon. They will not be trading in any vehicles as they can get more money through auctioning those vehicles.
- ii) They are fully staffed and are keeping busy.
- iii) Kidd presented his desire talked about earlier with the Board for a deputy for the Jackson area to complement the resident deputy concept. They will have to create another position for another city deputy. He discussed cutting back on manpower or shifting money to cover that cost. He would like to do that if it can be done without an additional tax burden.

c) PATTY JUSTESEN – TREASURER

- i) Justesen presented the Cassia County Statement of Treasurer's Cash for March 2012.
- ii) A tax deed sale has been set for May 14, 2012. There will also be a tax deed hearing for one or two parcels on June 4, 2012.
- iii) The Treasurer's Office is getting ready for the May 10th mailing for June property taxes.

d) DWIGHT DAVIS – ASSESSOR

- i) The Assessor's Office finished homesteader exemption and circuit breaker (Tax Reduction Program) signup last week.
- ii) They are getting things caught up with May deadlines for assessment notices.
- iii) Davis discussed House Bill 519 regarding developer's exemption issues. The application process is similar to homeowner's exemption and the Board will need to approve those applications. Two developers have expressed interest and they have been provided an application. The deadline is May 1, 2012, this year and next year it will be April 15th.

e) JOE LARSEN – CLERK

- i) Larsen reported on the retirement of Deputy Recorder Viki Osterhout effective June 1, 2012. That job opening has been posted and will close at 5:00 p.m. Wednesday, April 25, 2012.
- ii) Ballots will be sent out at the end of this week or beginning of next week to all mail in precincts for the May 15, 2012, Primary Election.
- iii) Budget letters will go out soon to all department heads for FY2013 budgeting. We encourage department heads to provide explanations of budgeting line item requests that will be reviewed by the budget office and recommendations will be provided for the Board for their consideration.
- iv) The Courts are working well and preparing for the eventual move to the new Justice Facility.

- v) Welfare Director Susan Keck, Larsen, and Commissioner Christensen attended a Welfare Meeting in Idaho Falls last week. The instruction was very informative.
- f) AL BARRUS – PROSECUTING ATTORNEY
 - i) Excused
- g) KERRY MCMURRAY – ADMINISTRATOR
 - i) McMurray reported on March building permits issued on building values in the amount of \$958,358.
 - ii) Planning and Zoning met last Thursday and are looking forward to potential regulation changes. A hearing will be held in May regarding proposed changes regarding Accessory Dwelling Units.
- h) AMBER PREWITT – ADULT MISDEMEANOR PROBATION
 - i) The deadline for policy and procedure manuals is due on June 30, 2012.
 - ii) Work is currently under way with developing standards for Adult Misdemeanor Probation and Kerry Hong from the Supreme Court will be meeting with them tomorrow after the regularly-scheduled jail meeting.
- i) DARWIN JOHNSON – MINI-CASSIA CRIMINAL JUSTICE CENTER
 - i) Johnson indicated that Deputy Director Russ Rasmussen’s is out of the workspace for a time.
 - ii) He went over the jail census. 182 are incarcerated, 172 available beds, with additional inmates using cots, 68 State holds, 52 Cassia and 42 Minidoka olds. Christensen indicated that historically Cassia County is about double that of Minidoka County.
 - iii) Johnson reported on a new MCCJC hire, Michael Rose.
- j) GORDON EDWARDS – WEED AND PEST CONTROL
 - i) Edwards reported on inspection of one to 15 boats a day being inspected for invasive species. They intercepted an infected barge. There are six people working right now and there is difficulty with short notice for those who report in sick.
 - ii) Edwards presented rental costs from one vendor. Currently he has his trailer at the inspection site. He requested a letter from the Commissioners for a sticker to put on invasive species employee’s vehicles for using turnarounds on the freeway. The use of that turnaround would decrease mileage expenses for employees.
 - iii) The weed department is in full force. They are currently working on 15 to 20 projects a day spraying weeds and sagebrush.
 - iv) The FLAG Committee tour will be planned sometime in June according to Chairman Crane. They are looking to get Kelly Crane back and people from Boise want to be there as well. The State of Idaho is advertising to replace Kelly Crane.
 - v) Gordon talked about discharge plans in place. NPDS will impact every farmer when it is concluded.

 - i) Extension Office Director Joel Packham and Wittman attended meetings in Boise to learn of what they can incorporate in our area.

 - iii) White Pine 4H After-School Program is concluding. They are having an Open House this week to see what they have accomplished.
 - iv) 4H registration is up this year. 100 youth are involved with the weighing in.

- a) The Legislative webinar was discussed and set up as calendared and presented during Department Head Meeting.

- a) Presented by Justesen to the Board during Department Head Meeting.
- 14) 10:30 AM SYNTHETIC OIL PRESENTATION
- a) Tom Zuiderveld from Schaeffer Oil in Jerome and Jim Bryant presented the prospect for use of synthetic oil for County vehicles. They have done a cost analysis and the City of Burley is switching over to synthetic lubricants. Currently they are going 3000 miles between drain intervals and Zuiderveld is comfortable in proposing that to be 8000 miles with the use of synthetic oil. He indicated that there would be no cost for an analysis. At 8000 it was determined that they could actually continue on to 10,000 miles before changing oil. The analysis indicated a significant costs savings. Christensen asked if they used an independent lab for their study. They utilize their own lab as others don't want the liability for advising you to go extended miles. He also indicated that they will stand behind their recommendations. They do work with big dairies, manufacturers, and other big businesses. Christensen talked about potential equipment failure and their lab will look that over and then it will also be sent out to an independent lab.
 - b) Zuiderveld presented a cost analysis used for Horizon Organic and detailed their savings of \$23,000.
 - c) Oil analysis kits cost \$9 each. A notice by email will come back within a week and a half after that analysis is sent in that can be reviewed on Schaeffer's website.
 - d) He talked about the history of Schaeffer Advantage synthetic lubrication business that began in 1839. They would be willing to show a presentation of the effectiveness of their product.

- a) SCOTT NANNENGA – FOREST SERVICE RANGER
 - i) Pine Creek timber sale at the bottom of Howell Canyon will be starting in the next couple of weeks. That area will be closed for firewood cutting during that time. They are going to put in a culvert near Pomerelle at the top of Bennett Springs to put that road back in place for access for firewood cutting.
 - ii) They are looking for volunteers for help at the lookout and there have been no inquiries. There is a need for volunteers for just a couple of days a week. A campground host at Lake Cleveland can also assist.
 - iii) Nannenga discussed permitting at Piney Cabin as presented in an earlier Board meeting by FLAG Board Member Mike Poulton. He will file a permit application. Poulton wants everyone to form a loose association for one permit and one fee.
