- c) Abenroth cited the statute on budget stating that if it raises the budget on this day then it cannot be done.
- d) Christensen inquired if this was in the proposed budget or not.
- e) Abenroth stated that it had been cut out and has not been included in the proposed budget which is being advertised for today's hearing.
- f) Chairman Crane asked to hold this matter until the budget hearing with the MCCJC later in the day.

10) 9:14 AM DELIBERATE ON DATA STORAGE NEEDS AND COSTS FOR THE MCCJC. CONSIDER OPTIONS AND APPROVE.

- a) Johnson stated that he is waiting for Ben from Stephenson's to give him a quote as to what they could acquire the storage for.

b) Christensen said they could get sixty days worth of storage for \$21,000.00, but are waiting to hear the cost for more storage.

It also funds this coalition and their travel & support services. The County did not pay towards this in the last couple of years, but did in 2008 and 2009.

i) McMurray stated that it is not a specific line item, but it would fall under dues and fees and there would be money in there for it.

ii) This is a voluntary program watched over by IAC.

h) Christensen asked if it was Payment in Lieu of Taxes (PILT) and Secure Rural Schools (SRS) or just SRS. McMurray states that it is just SRS.

i) Kunau made commented in regards to SRS. Christensen thinks it is over \$200,000.00 of SRS money in addition to PILT.

ii) McMurray said the amount dropped \$60,000.00 to \$70,000.00. Kunau made comments as to permanency of those reductions.

i) Christensen looked on the internet for the SRS Distribution for 2015. Christensen asked if this could be tabled so that further research can be conducted into this matter.

a) CHANGE OF STATUS

i) MCCJC

- (1) McMurray explained that MCCJC Change of Status (COS) requests for the employees that failed the physical fitness tests was to move their wages to include failure to complete physical fitness tests. McMurray wondered if there is sufficient money budgeted to handle these increases by 10/01/15. McMurray stated that this is not a \$0.50 per hour increase but rather a \$50.00 a month increase.
- (2) Chairman Crane inquired as to COS's.
  - (a) Kunau questioned the bilingual issue in the Sheriff's department.
- (3) Kunau cited that there are COS requests for Jerome County Deputies to work part time on an "as needed" basis at the MCCJC at \$15.00 per hour.
- (4) Chairman Crane inquired of Larsen as to the COS requests that are on the agenda and how they affect the budget. Larsen discussed the impact this had on the budget and stated that the decision is up to the Board.
- (5) Kunau inquired about the bilingual pay increase for new hires. Larsen responded how that is handled in his own department.
- (6) Chairman Crane asked for a motion for part time detention officers and new hires Julio Victoria and Crecensiano Gonzalez. The latter two have passed physical fitness tests and are bilingual.
- (7) McMurray stated that in the past the County has paid a premium for bilingual. Larsen offered to look for a history as to how these types of hires have been handled in the past.
- (8) Crane suggested holding this issue for the two new hires that are bilingual for a week or two while Larsen investigates.

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## **SCHEDULED INFORMATION AND ACTION AGENDA ITEMS**

### 22) 9:30 AM COUNTY BUDGET HEARING

- a) Larsen addressed the Board citing their office's compliance with County Budget requirements as outlined in Idaho Code § 3-16.
- b) Chairman Crane commended those departments that complied with the Board's instructions to forego "A" budgeting in their requests until "B" budgets were accumulated.
- c) Chairman Crane went over the budgets by each department.
- d) Todd Quast gave clarification of 9-1-1 funds.
- e) Heward stated he did not request that the Mini-Cassia Drug Task Force to be cut in half. Detective Kevin Horak clarified the amounts and that it is a joint program with Minidoka County.
- f) Larsen showed that the amount allocated was exactly what the Sheriff's office requested.
- g) McMurray explained the physical facilities budget and stated that there will be no building reserve budgeted this year.
- h) The Violent Predator Fund account was explained by Larsen.
- i) Conflict Public Defender Fund required increases were explained by Christensen.
- j) Larsen stated that overall the Justice Fund has been substantially stressed. He stated he had concerns about Public Defense possibly not being funded enough based on costs experienced for FY2015. He had originally recommended budgeting \$70,000.00 but the Board recommended cutting it in half.
- k) Christensen addressed the increase in Juvenile Probation budget as presented by Minidoka County.
- l) Heward commented on the cuts in the Patrol Budget. He stated the County only gets \$5.00 on infraction tickets, \$10.00 for felonies, and \$10.00 for misdemeanors. He said he has cut a school resource officer as well as a security officer at the MCCJC.
- m) Chairman Crane inquired as to limiting security at the MCCJC and Heward said he will provide security as per discussion he has had with the judges.
- n) Heward addressed why a position had been added in the Clerk's department. Larsen explained a position had not been added but rather a position budgeted for a court interpreter in the Courts budget was shifted to the Recorder's office where the needs were greater to fill that position.
- o) Heward addressed the Board as to how to carry forward next year. Kunau responded to this inquiry
- p) Larsen addressed the wage and salary increases for FY2016. The Board approved the Auditor's office recommendation of a \$0.50 cent per hour increase in allocation in each department attributed to the number of employees. The Board decided previously to include \$0.25 per hour as a cost of living increase for every employee and \$0.25 to be based on merit amongst department employees.
- q) Heward asked about accrued time payment for a retired employee coming out of the Commissioner's budget. Larsen explained it was not in the Commissioner's budget but rather was setup as a Discretionary Employee Compensation Fund and the protocol of the Board's resolution needs to be followed to obtain the Board's approval.
- r) Heward reviewed incentives as having been a long standing program and asked if it has been taken away. Evans reported that the Board approved \$7,200.00 for basic POST certification to be put back into the patrol budget. She stated that the numbers for other incentives were not originally presented to the Auditor's office for this budget. Christensen asked if bilingual status is accounted for as an incentive. Larsen stated that it should be included in the job descriptions but is not allocated specifically.
- s) Warrell stated that the Sheriff's office submitted a pay scale and did not cut any monies out of their request.

- t) Christensen addressed the Juvenile Detention increases based on number of detainees. Cassia County's percentage of detainees for the year we much higher than usual causing increases in our share of expenses.
- u) Johnson addressed reductions in the MCCJC budget, citing the Boards meetings on 07/24/2015 and 07/27/2015.
- v) Kunau reviewed positions being cut and or added. Johnson stated that there is a shortfall of \$30,409.60 plus benefits for an additional floor officer.
- w) Larsen stated that there was no mistake made in the budget and that it was related directly to the request of the Board. Chairman Crane felt more time needs to be taken to review the matter.
- x) Christensen felt there could possibly be a problem with a floor position at the jail not being implemented in the budget and said the FY2016 budget could be opened at a later date if needed.
- y) Johnson asked if certifications and promotions are going to be honored.
- z) Chairman Crane felt that step and grade has never really been addressed. Christensen said there would be additional pay for certification but it was not clear as yet regarding bilingual pay increment.
- aa) Heward said increases in rate of pay will come out of the overtime.
- bb) Budget totals were presented by Crane:
  - i) Total Budget - \$16,729,350.00
  - ii) Total Funds - \$14,582,454.00
  - iii) Current Expense - \$3,060,690.00
  - iv) Justice Fund - \$8,775,053.00
- cc) Revenues were discussed and it was pointed out that expenditure requests had exceeded identified revenues due to less funding than what has been historical from grants, court fines and fees, citations, and from the law enforcement contract with the City of Burley.
- dd) Larsen requested to make a couple of footnote explanation changes on the final budget regarding Solid Waste and Juvenile Probation budgets as appropriately referred to by Christensen.
- ee) Casey Anderson, citizen and City of Burley Councilman addressed the Board with some concerns regarding carryover dollars in the Sheriff's budget. It was explained to Anderson that carryover money funds the beginning of the fiscal year for each department when revenues are scares until the tax drive.
- ff) Abenroth stated that the budget is based on Idaho statute and changes requested with that process would have to be addressed with legislators.
- gg) Anderson made reference to resolutions that the Board sets forth and also discussed concerns of the Board micro-managing of county departments.
- hh) Citizen Ruthe Hobbs stressed the need for public safety being the number one concern. She also felt there was some fluff that money is expended for. Chairman Crane asked what she felt the fluff was and she expressed her willingness to sit down with the Board to go over that.
- ii) Chairman Crane expressed appreciation for all the comments that were made.
